Growth is first three months signals full pandemic recovery

A record-setting winter tourist season has boosted the Barbadian economy by 4.1 per cent from January to March, marking an "unprecedented" run of expansion for 12 quarters in a row and putting the COVID-19 pandemic's economic crisis firmly in the rear-view mirror, the Central Bank of Barbados said. Both in real and nominal terms, the first three months have been a "very strong quarter", buoyed by tourism's "extraordinary performance" with a 14.8 per cent increase in visitor arrivals. The central bank chief also disclosed that arrivals by sea recovered strongly, moving 96 per cent close to pre-pandemic levels, driven by an additional 15 cruise ship calls. There was broad-based growth in other productive sectors of the economy but agricultural output dipped, which the Central Bank blamed on extreme heat.

Concerns even amid solid economic growth

The latest review of the Barbados economy by the Central Bank governor Dr Kevin Greenidge presented the kind of backdrop with which any administration would be pleased. The Central Bank of Barbados (CBB) announced in its last quarterly update on May 30 that the economy grew by 4.1 per cent in the first nine months of 2023, the biggest comparative expansion since 2006, excluding the COVID-19 pandemic recovery period last year when it improved by 17.3 per cent. In addition to the growth, we learned that more Barbadians entered the job market as unemployment dropped in the second quarter to 8.5 per cent.

Govt to introduce "patent box" to promote innovation

The government announced plans to introduce a 'patent box' regime aimed at encouraging research, development and innovation. A patent box is a tax incentive that allows companies to apply a lower corporate tax rate to profits earned from patented inventions and other intellectual property. As he introduced the Corporate Top-up Tax Bill and the Income Tax (Amendment) Bill Minister in the Ministry of Finance and Economic Affairs Ryan Straughn told the House of Assembly that the patent box initiative would entice more research and development to these shores while encouraging businesses to expand their potential with patents and innovation through collaborations with creatives across the world.

Climate resilient agriculture

Barbados is poised to make strides in climate-resilient agriculture through a US\$4 million (BDS\$8 million) project spearheaded by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) Subregional Office for the Caribbean. Funded by the Global Environment Facility (GEF), the project which aims to enhance climate-resilient technologies and strengthen the country's agri-food system is set to begin in 2026. The project is designed to improve various climate-resilient agricultural practices, including protected agriculture, solar-powered irrigation systems, and closed-loop systems for production, said FAO Climate Change Officer Jacinto Buenfil.
