Therefore, there was an increase of 120.89%
3	MECHANICAL APPLIANCES; PARTS THEREOF (HS:84)	There has been a significant increase on "NUCLEAR REACTORS, BOILERS, MACHINERY AND MECHANICAL APPLIANCES; PARTS THEREOF" (HS:84) as last year the trade between Cyprus and India was only 850,040 euro for the period of January – July 2023. Therefore, there was an increase of 149.85%

2. Important India related statements of commercial significance by political leaders; think tanks, chambers, associations etc:

On 03rd October 2024, Mr. Manish, High Commissioner of India to Cyprus had a meeting with Mr. Doros Venezis, Director of the Diplomatic Office of President. Both sides discussed various aspects of bilateral relations and discussed ways to enhance cooperation between India and Cyprus especially in the areas of trade, technology, talent and tourism.

On 3rd October 2024 - Meeting of First Secretary (EA) with Mr. Philokypros Roussounides, Director General of Cyprus Hotel Association The meeting with Mr. Roussounides was aimed at reinforcing the hospitality and tourism partnership between India and Cyprus. With India's booming outbound tourism and expertise in hospitality, discussions likely covered areas where Indian professionals could contribute to Cyprus's tourism sector. Collaborative ventures may have been proposed, such as joint training programs and professional mobility to bring seasoned Indian hospitality talent to Cypriot hotels. Potential Indian investments in Cyprus's hotel industry may have been explored, as well as opportunities for promoting both nations as mutual travel

destinations. Furthermore, the meeting identified strategies to leverage the membership of the Cyprus Hotels Association to participate in the upcoming Indian Whisky Tasting Event.

On 3rd October 2024 - Meeting of First Secretary(EA) with Indian Restaurants. This gathering brought together representatives from Indian dining establishments across Cyprus, fostering a platform for support and shared growth. Discussions centered on increasing the visibility and accessibility of Indian cuisine within the local market. The potential for participation in promotional campaigns, cultural events featuring Indian events, and support of the High Commission of India for awards given by Government of India were explored. Collaboration with local tourism agencies to incorporate Indian food experiences in travel packages to Cyprus were also suggested, along with proposals to enhance service standards. The meeting culminated in strategies to position Indian cuisine as a prominent feature of Cyprus's diverse food scene, further strengthening cultural ties.

On 06thOctober 2024, Mr. Manish, High Commissioner of India to Cyprus visited Athienou village with Mr. Kyriacos Kareklas, Mayor of Athienou and participated in the fair organized by the City Council. The Mayor graciously provided a tour, offering insights into the local economy and showcasing local products.

On 07th October 2024 Hon'ble Justice Surya Kant, Supreme Court of India, Ld. Attorney General R. Venkataramani High Commissioner Mr. Manish and First Secretary (EA) Mr. Subhash Jangala participated in the Commonwealth Legal Education Association (CLEA) International Conference 2024 on "Law and Technology, Opportunities and Challenges for the Maritime and Shipping Sector in the EU and the Commonwealth" and delivered keynote addresses. Justice Surya Kant and Attorney General R. Venkataramani also participated in a session on 'Rule of Law and Technology'.

On 07th October 2024, Hon'ble Justice Surya Kant, Supreme Court of India, Ld. Attorney General R. Venkataramani and High Commissioner Mr. Manish met with Ms. Katerina Stamatiou, President of the Supreme Court of Cyprus and Ms. Rea Limnatitou, Former President of the Court of Appeal Director Cyprus Judicial Training School at the Supreme Court complex in Nicosia. They exchanged information on the functioning of the judiciary of both countries and appreciated the commonality between the legal systems of India and Cyprus respectively. Justice Surya Kant briefed on the use of technology in Supreme Court of India and also apprised about the training programs conducted to train and update the knowledge of judicial officers and judges working at District, High Courts and Supreme Court.

On 08th October 2024, Hon'ble Justice Surya Kant of the Supreme Court of India, Ld. Attorney General R. Venkataramani and High Commissioner Mr. Manish met with Mr. George L. Savvides, Attorney General of the Republic of Cyprus. The discussions focused on the shared legal frameworks and judicial practices of both nations, acknowledging the commonalities between the legal systems of India and Cyprus. Justice Surya Kant highlighted India's judicial reforms aimed at enhancing transparency, efficiency, and access to justice. Both sides expressed appreciation for the potential to deepen legal cooperation and emphasized the importance of sustained collaboration to further strengthen their judicial systems.

On 9th October 2024 – Visit of First Secretary (EA) to DIGITAL AGENDA CYPRUS SUMMIT by KATHIMERINI. The Digital Agenda Cyprus Summit was a pivotal event focusing on the nation's digital transformation roadmap, hosted by KATHIMERINI. First Secretary attended to understand the important changes to the digital landscape in Cyprus. The summit provided a unique platform to explore partnerships on digital policy, considering India's expertise in scalable technology solutions for financial inclusion, health, and education. Presentations were made on collaborative projects in e-governance, digital literacy, and cybersecurity. The event underscored Cyprus'

commitment to fostering digital collaborations that align with Cyprus's aspirations for a resilient digital economy.

On 10th October 2024 – First Secretary's Online Meeting with Mr. Lefteris Eleftheriou, Head of Filming, Invest Cyprus. In this online session with Mr. Eleftheriou, discussions focused on Cyprus's potential as a destination for Indian filmmakers. Cyprus, with its scenic landscapes and favorable film production incentives, presents opportunities for India's expanding media and entertainment sector to consider it as a viable international filming location. Topics of discussion included coproduction agreements, access to local resources and expertise, and potential financial incentives that Invest Cyprus could offer. The dialogue also opened avenues for cultural exchange, as Indian filmmakers could bring Cyprus's unique locales into Indian cinema, while benefiting Cyprus's economy through tourism and job creation. This collaboration could pave the way for increased visibility for both countries in each other's media landscapes. A presentation was made by the First Secretary on the India International Film Festival 2024, the Film Bazaar 2024 and the upcoming Waves Summit in India.

On 11th October 2024, Mr. Manish, High Commissioner of India to Cyprus and Mr. Subhash Jangala FS (EA) had a meeting with Dr. Nicodemos Damianou, Deputy Minister of Research, Innovation, and Digital Policy, Mr. Demetris Skourides, Chief Scientist for Research, Innovation and Technology of the Republic of Cyprus and Mr. Marios Tannousis, CEO, Invest-Cyprus. The meeting reviewed the follow up action on Minister's visit to India and the way forward for enhancing economic engagement between India and Republic of Cyprus. Several important points were discussed including DPI, DEPA, attractiveness of Cyprus to Indian Startups, success of Reflect Festival and the success of the participation of Deputy Minister and delegation at the CII-India Mediterranean Business Conclave.

On 14th October 2024, Mr. Manish, High Commissioner of India to Cyprus and Mr. Subhash Jangala, FS(EA) had a meeting with Prof. Andreas Efstathiou, Rector, and Prof. Loizos Symeou, Vice Rector of European University Cyprus. The Rector gave a presentation on the journey of the University; its achievements and curriculum, while the High Commissioner shared a comprehensive overview of India's vibrant education sector, exploring potential avenues for collaboration with Indian academic institutions.

On 15th October 2024 - Webinar on ODOP Collaboration. High Commissioner of India to Cyprus, Mr. Manish and First Secretary (EA), Mr. Subhash Jangala, participated in a webinar introducing India's "One District One Product" (ODOP) initiative by Invest India. ODOP is a flagship program showcasing unique Indian products to Indian diaspora abroad and audiences of other countries. Discussions explored how ODOP could facilitate trade in specialized goods from various Indian districts, creating a niche market in Cyprus. Collaborative efforts could involve promoting Indian handicrafts, textiles, and agricultural products, potentially through trade fairs, exhibitions, or popup stores in Cyprus. The session highlighted how ODOP could enrich Cypriot consumer choices while supporting India's local artisans and small businesses. The webinar also discussed proposals on distribution channels, regulatory requirements, and promotional strategies to enhance the visibility of ODOP items in Cyprus, thereby strengthening commercial ties and cultural appreciation.

On 15th October 2024 - Meeting with Rector of UNIC, Mr. Phillipos Pouyioutas. The visit of Mr. Manish, the High Commissioner of India to Cyprus and Mr. Subhash Jangala, First Secretary (EA) to the University of Nicosia (UNIC) underscored India's educational presence in Cyprus, with a particular focus on supporting Indian students and creating academic partnerships. The meeting involved discussions on structured support networks, enhanced student services, and academic exchange opportunities to improve the learning experience for Indian students. Potential joint research programs were explored, allowing Indian and Cypriot scholars to collaborate on projects

relevant to both nations. A tour of the campus and interaction with Indian students highlighted UNIC's commitment to providing an inclusive environment, while the presence of Indian students at UNIC was acknowledged as a bridge for deepening Indo-Cypriot cultural understanding.

On 17th October 2024, Mr. Manish, High Commissioner of India to Cyprus and Mr. Subhash Jangala, FS(EA) had a meeting with officials from FINCAP Advisers. Discussions focused around the various activities of the company & their interest in expanding their work in India. High Commissioner gave an overview of the opportunities in India and identified key sectors for investment and outlined opportunities in GIFT city, Gujarat.

On 21st October 2024, Mr. Manish, High Commissioner of India to Cyprus and Mr. Subhash Jangala, FS (EA) participated in the Roundtable Discussion hosted by Invest Cyprus, which was attended by key stakeholders from the government, ministries, bank, and Indian businesses and entrepreneurs in Cyprus. The presence of Mr. Nicodemos Damianou, Deputy Minister of Research Innovation and Digital Policy, Mr. Evgenios Evgeniou, the Chairman of Invest Cyprus, and Mr. Marios Tannousis, CEO of Invest Cyprus added significant value to the discussion. The discussion focused on using opportunities in Cyprus for bilateral investment in key sectors like innovation, IT, shipping, technology, and renewable energy. Indian entrepreneurs highlighted the business-friendly environment, strategic location, and favourable incentives in Cyprus, providing valuable input on the way forward to make Cyprus a more attractive investment destination. Both sides committed to sustained collaboration, with Invest Cyprus and the Business Facilitation Unit providing necessary support to Indian investors looking to expand into European and other regional markets.

On 21st October 2024, Mr. Manish High Commissioner of India to Cyprus had a meeting with entrepreneurs of Indigo Tales an initiative dedicated to curating and showcasing handicrafts, textiles, and weaves from of India. The collection features eco-friendly and ethically sourced textiles, including home décor, jewellery, and wearables. The discussion focused on promoting these unique OPOP products from India and exploring collaborative opportunities to support artisans and sustain traditional craftsmanship. Both sides emphasized the importance of ethical sourcing and the impact of these initiatives on local communities. The meeting highlighted potential partnerships to promote OPDP that could further elevate the visibility of Indian handicrafts in Cyprus.

On 24th October 2024, The High Commission of India in partnership with NSDC India hosted a webinar on "Opportunities in Migration of Skilled Manpower between India and Cyprus." This milestone event, was hosted by Nicosia Chamber of Commerce & Industry. Over 60 participants from 15 different sectors from Cyprus including construction, healthcare, hospitality, and manufacturing participated in the event. From the High Commission of India, High Commissioner of India, FS (EA) AND Attaché (commerce) attended the meeting. High Commissioner Mr. Manish welcomed the participants, reaffirming India's commitment to support Republic of Cyprus in the area of skilled manpower for mutual benefit of both countries. Mr. Ajay Raina, COO, Dr. Dnyaneshwar Mulay, Advisor and Mr. Sudhanshu Aggarwal, Business Head to NSDC International, presented India's Skill India Mission initiatives, highlighting frameworks for global skilling and way forward for talent mobility from India and Cyprus. The strong participation of Nicosia Chamber, Larnaca Chamber and Pafos Chamber, CCCI Cyprus and Cypriot business entities, such as NetU Group and CITEA CY underscored shared goals in talent exchange and market expansion, marking a significant step in strengthening the India-Cyprus partnership.

On 30th October 2024, Mr. Manish High Commissioner of India to Cyprus met with Prof. Andreas Theophanous, Professor of Political Economy, Head, Department of Politics and International Affairs, University of Nicosia and President of Cyprus Centre for European Affairs. They exchanged

views on regional issues and discussed ideas for bilateral engagement between HCI Nicosia and Cyprus Centre for European Affairs at the University of Nicosia.

Webinars with stakeholders in the Food and Beverage Industry. During the month, The First Secretary (EA) held webinars with representatives of the Cyprus Hotels Association, the Cyprus Restaurants Association, the Cyprus Chefs Association, the Cyprus Bartenders Association, the Association of Alcoholic Beverage Importers in Cyprus, the Cyprus Supermarkets Association to invite important stakeholders in the Alcoholic Beverages market of Cyprus to the upcoming Indian Whisky Tasting Session which is being conducted with an aim to expand the market of premium Indian whiskies. The event is being held on the 25th of November 2024.

General Barriers to FDI in Cyprus

- 1. A significant amount of troubled assets remains in the economy. These assets are managed outside the banking sector by credit acquiring and credit-servicing companies. While the supervision of credit acquiring companies has been strengthened, there are still challenges related to their operating environment.
- 2. Achieving environmentally sustainable economic growth is still a key challenge. Cyprus is among the Member States with the highest greenhouse gas emissions per person. With its existing measures, it will fall 15 pps short of its effort sharing reduction target of 24% compared to its 2005 base year emissions. High dependence on imported oil, which makes up around 85.6% of the country's energy mix, is the main cause of higher emissions and exposes Cyprus to price fluctuations on the international oil market.

- 3. Cyprus is lagging behind in the digital transition. Cyprus ranks among the lowest in the Commission's Digital Economy and Society Index (DESI) Report for 2022. Notably, while Cyprus is performing better in digital public services than in the other DESI dimensions, it is lagging behind in the categories 'fixed very high capacity network coverage', 'basic digital skills', 'shortages of information communications technology specialists' and 'relatively high broadband price'
- 4. Russia is Cyprus' second most important tourist market after the UK. Its share of total tourist arrivals and revenues hovered around 20%.
- 5. Cyprus' exports to Russia include information communication technology, accounting, consulting, as well as shipping and transport services, which accounted for 17.5% of total exports of services in 2020. The disconnection of several Russian Banks from the Society for Worldwide Interbank Financial Telecommunications (SWIFT), as well as the negative impact of sanctions on Russian companies are expected to negatively affect these sectors.

a) Inflation 0.6% - October 2024

In October 2024, the Consumer Price Index increased by 0,16 units and reached 118,64 units compared to 118,48 units in September 2024. In October 2024, the inflation increased by 0,6%. (Table 1)

For the period January-October 2024, the CPI increased by 1.8% compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. (Table 1)

Compared to October 2023, the largest changes were observed in the categories of Restaurants and Hotels (5,4%), Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (5,0%), and Transportation (-6,9%). (Table 1)

Compared to September 2024, the largest changes were observed in the categories of Clothing and Footwear (3,1%) and Education (1,1%). (Table 1)

For the period January – October 2024, compared to the corresponding period of last year, the largest change was recorded in the category of Restaurants and Hotels (5,7%). (Table 1)

b) Unemployment -4.6% - October 2024

The unemployed persons, registered at the District Labour Offices on the last day of October 2024, reached 7.781 persons. Based on the seasonally adjusted data that show the trend of unemployment, the number of registered unemployed for October 2024 decreased to 10.208 persons in comparison to 10.265 in the previous month.

In comparison with October 2023, a decrease of 1.451 persons or 15,7% was recorded, attributed mainly to the sectors of financial and insurance activities, construction, trade, manufacturing, as well as to the decrease recorded for newcomers in the labour market.

c) Main developments October 2024

FOREIGN TRADE STATISTICS: July 2024

Total imports of goods amounted to €1.056,0 mn in July 2024 as compared to €1.117,5 mn in July 2023, recording a decrease of 5,5%.

Exports of domestically produced products, including stores and provisions, in July 2024 were €216,0 mn as compared to €227,4 mn in July 2023, recording a decrease of 5,0%. Domestic exports of industrial products in July 2024 were €207,4 mn compared to €222,6 mn in July 2023, whilst domestic exports of agricultural products in July 2024 were €7,5 mn compared to €3,6 mn in July 2023.

Exports of foreign products, including stores and provisions, in July 2024 were €111,1 mn as compared to €168,2 mn in July 2023, recording a decrease of 33,9%.
