(Gulf Daily News 01.06.2023) Ties discussed: INDUSTRY and Commerce Minister Abdulla bin Adel Fakhro held a meeting with India's Ministry of External Affairs secretary for consular, passport, visa and overseas Indian affairs Dr Ausaf Sayeed and his delegation, who are on an official visit to the kingdom to attend the sixth session of consultations between Bahrain and India. The minister affirmed the depth of ties between Bahrain and India, stressing the importance of developing the economic partnerships and achieving common goals. He also highlighted Bahrain's suitable investment environment. He highlighted

the initial positive results of the official visit of the Bahraini economic delegation to India.

(Gulf Daily News 01.06.2023) India's GDP grows 6.1pc: INDIA'S economic growth accelerated to 6.1 per cent in the first quarter, government data showed, boosted by government and private capital spending even as private consumption remained sluggish. India remains one of the fastest growing emerging economies, especially with China's recovery stumbling. The government expects growth could remain around 6.5pc in the current fiscal year, despite risks emerging from a global slowdown. "The risks are evenly balanced between the downside and the upside," V Anantha Nageswaran, chief economic adviser at the finance ministry, told reporters after the data release.

(The Daily Tribune/Al Watan 01.06.2023) India records strong 7.2% growth: India's GDP grew by 7.2% in the year to March, official figures showed yesterday, boosted by services and consumption, putting it among the world's fastest-expanding major economies. The South Asian nation is the world's fifth-largest economy, and recently surpassed China to become the most populous country. Its growth has rebounded since the pandemic -- the economy rocketed 9.1% in the 2021- 22 financial year.

(The Daily Tribune 04.06.2023) India- Bahrain ties highlighted: The Indian Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), Secretary (CPV and OIA), H.E. Dr. Ausaf Sayeed, paid an official visit to the Kingdom of Bahrain for the 6th Foreign Office Consultations (FOC) between the two countries. He also visited the Minister of Industry and Commerce, H.E. Abdullah bin Adel Fakhro. Dr. Sayeed and Bahrain Foreign Affairs Ministry (MoFA) Undersecretary (Political Affairs), H.E. Dr. Shaikh Abdulla bin Ahmed Al Khalifa, co-chaired the 6th FOC, joined by MoFA Bahrain Undersecretary (Consular Affairs), H.E. Dr. Mohamed Ali Bahzad. They reviewed all areas of bilateral cooperation, including in the domains of politics, security, space, youth, parliament, media, and information, trade, and energy, including renewable energy, fintech, IT, big data, health, tourism, labour and consular issues, culture and education, and people-to-people engagement, and discussed matters of mutual interest in regional and multilateral domains. Both sides expressed satisfaction with the steady progress in various areas of bilateral cooperation and reiterated their commitment to further strengthening the relationship. They noted the impressive growth of bilateral trade and economic collaboration, with bilateral trade reaching close to USD 2 billion in FY 2022–23, almost doubling from the pre-Covid period.

(Gulf Daily News 07.06.2023) India offers \$455m to woo battery projects: INDIA will offer 37.6 billion rupees (\$455.2 million) in incentives to companies setting up battery storage projects totalling 4,000 megawatt hours (MWh) under a scheme announced earlier this year, government sources said. The scheme, details of which were not previously known, is intended to boost battery storage projects critical to India's ambitious plan to expand its renewable energy capacity to 500 gigawatts (GW) by 2030. It also aims to cut the cost of battery energy storage from the current 5.5-6.5 rupees per unit.

(Gulf Daily News 19.06.2023) Tax boost: The Indian government said yesterday that its net direct tax receipts rose 11 per cent year-on-year to 3.80 trillion Indian rupees (\$46.39 billion) from April 1-June 17. Tax receipts include tax paid by corporates of 1.57 trillion rupees and personal income tax of Rs 2.22 trillion rupees, a Ministry of Finance statement said.

(The Daily Tribune 20.06.2023) US-India ties 'turning point': Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi heads to the US this week for a visit billed as a turning point for bilateral relations, with deeper cooperation in defence industry and sharing high technology in sharp focus. The visit is expected to give India access to critical American technologies Washington rarely shares with non-allies, strengthening a new bond that is underpinned by not just global politics but also business and economics.

(Al Watan 21.06.2023) Minister of Industry: Strong relations between Bahrain and India: Minister of Industry and Commerce Abdullah Fakhro affirmed the depth of the close relations between the Kingdom of Bahrain and the friendly Republic of India, recalling their historical extension, especially at the commercial level. This came during his participation as a keynote speaker in the working lunch organized by the Bahrain India Society, in the presence of the Ambassador of the Republic of India to Bahrain Piyush Srivastava, and the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Bahrain India Society, Abdul Rahman Juma, and a number of members of the society.

(Al Watan/BNA 25.06.2023) Amazon pledges investments in India worth \$15 billion: Amazon.com CEO Andy Jassy told Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi during their meeting Friday that the company will invest an additional \$15 billion in India. He added that the investment will raise the total value of the

e-commerce giant's investments in all sectors in India to \$26 billion by 2030.
