Al Watan 06.05.2023 Muraleedharan: \$2 billion in bilateral trade between Bahrain and India this year: Indian Minister of State for External Affairs Shri Muraleedharan revealed that bilateral trade between the Kingdom of Bahrain and India has risen to a new and unprecedented record, with a value of \$2 billion this year.

The Daily 09.05.2023 US, Saudi, UAE and India discuss railway project: The US is currently in talks with Saudi Arabia, the UAE, and India to construct a project that would link Middle Eastern nations through a network of railway lines. Reports claimed that the railways would also be connected to India via shipping lanes from ports in the region. Sources say that the White House National Security Advisor, Jake Sullivan, is expected to arrive in Saudi Arabia on Saturday, and will meet with Saudi, Emirati, and Indian counterparts next week to further discuss the proposed project and other regional issues.

The Daily Tribune 18.05.2023 Tesla restarts India market talks with new factory proposal: Tesla Inc (TSLA.O) has proposed setting up a factory in India to build electric cars for domestic sale and export, the carmaker told government officials on Wednesday, according to a source with direct knowledge of the matter. The proposal comes after India refused to agree to Tesla's request last year to lower the import tax on cars, which can reach as much as 100%.

BNA 24.05.2023 India makes tests mandatory for cough syrup export after overseas deaths: India will make tests mandatory for cough syrups before they are exported, a government notice showed on Tuesday, after Indian-made cough syrups were linked to the deaths of dozens of children in Gambia and Uzbekistan. Any cough syrup must have a certificate of analysis issued by a government laboratory before it is exported, effective June 1, the government said in a notice dated May 22 and shared by the health ministry on Tuesday, Reuters reported.

BNA 27.05.2023 Indian Minister: India will become the fourth largest economy in the world within two years: Enabling policies and grassroot initiatives of Modi-led government have led to social and economic transformation of the country since 2014, and the nation is all set to become the fourth largest

economy in world within two years, Union minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said on Saturday.
